Our learning in Nursery

Topic

Our half term topic started with a bang, fizz and crackle! As we learned all about fireworks in the night sky. We read a story about a little hedgehog who was scared of the fireworks and talked about fire safety. We were very lucky to have a space VR visit and have been learning all about the planets in our solar system. The children have really enjoyed this week's story 'Whatever Next', helping Teddy get ready for a journey to the moon and thinking about what we might take.....someone said a tin of beans! We still have such an exciting term ahead of us learning about the differences between day and night, nocturnal animals and of course Christmas and The Nativity!

L4L (Lessons for life)

The children have used some time to revisit our zones of regualtion, reminding ourselves at the start of term, how to label our emotions and what we can do to support them. Ask your child, if they can show some happy finger breathing, it really helps us back into the Green Zone. We also have been wearing our odd socks to celebrate that it is ok to be different and the children told us' respect means everyone joining in and being kind'.

Topic
