

I am writing to inform you of the exciting new service that will be taking place within the school as of this year.

Bierton CE Combined School is going to be implementing Buckinghamshire Mind's Peer Support in School's service where some of our Year 5s and Year 6s have been trained by Bucks Mind staff to become peer mentors to students within the school.

The role of a peer mentor includes the following:

Being a listening ear for other students

Being on duty in the drop-in room or outside on the playground

Being a mental health ambassador within the school

Creating promotional posters and assemblies for the service

Passing on any worries to a teacher

As well as the training day, Bucks Mind staff also come in throughout the year and hold feedback sessions with our mentors and students who have used the service, this is to gain feedback and see how the service is going but also to offer support where it may be needed.

We would also like to inform you of the parent coffee morning that is included within the peer support service as well. This session will be open to parents across the school to attend to discuss topics around mental health, learn more about the peer support service and to gain information on local and national useful organisations. We will be sending out invitations and more information on this in due course.

# **The Listening Club (TLC)**

On Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> September, 20 of our Year 5 and Year 6 students received some 'Peer Support' training from Bucks Mind. The reason these children were selected is because they volunteered to be peer mentors at Bierton and to support the other children in our school with their worries. The training involved learning about different types of mental health and worries that children and young people might experience. They played a range of games to get to know each other and even had a go at role playing as a student with worries coming to see a mentor. They also learnt about the importance of confidentiality and safeguarding.

Some memorable quotes for the day included:


- 'Everyone has a mental health because everyone has feelings'- Logan

Since the training, the peer mentors have had a meeting to discuss what the next steps are. They have decided they would like to be called 'The Listening Club (TLC)' instead of peer mentors. There will be 4 children from TLC on duty outside at lunchtime to support any children who are feeling sad or who have nobody to play with. In addition to this, 4 children from TLC will be on duty inside school for children to 'drop-in' and have a chat if they need to. TLC will be wearing blue personalised bibs so they are easily identified and they will be launching their service in an upcoming assembly.

This is an exciting new role and our peer mentors displayed excellent listening skills during the training session, with the staff from Bucks Mind saying that they were the most focused and engaged primary school students they had trained! They are going to be wonderful ambassadors for mental health across the school and they are keen and ready to get started!

This month's top tip focuses on Net Aware and how they have updated their website and services.

### What is Net Aware?

Net Aware is a website which provides a guides on the latest and most popular social networks, apps and games children are using.

Net Aware, which is a collaboration between O2 and the NSCPCC, now includes more tips and advice. On the website, news stories which cover the latest trends and most pressing issues children face online can also be found.

# How can Net Aware help you?

On the website, there is a range of information, as well as different support services.

### Social networks, app and game reviews

Net Aware experts have reviewed some of the most popular social networks, apps and games which children are using, including: popular apps (such as Instagram, Snapchat and Tik Tok); new apps (such as Harry Potter: Wizards Unite); and other less familiar apps (such as Line and Monkey). Each review includes tips on how to keep your child safe when using the social network, app or game. There are also top tips from an O2 Guru.

## In the news

Within this area of the website, you can find information to help keep you up to date with the latest goings on in the world of social networks, apps and games. There will be a focus on new platforms and online trends. The news section will help you keep track of the ever-changing online world. If a new game comes out, social media issues make the headlines (again), or there's just something they feel you should know, this is the place to look.

## Net Aware newsletter

Net Aware are producing newsletters, which include the latest news and reviews. You can sign up to their mailing system and stay on top of what's going on in the world of social networks, apps and games.

# Tips and advice

This area of the website provides answers to many important queries. Topics covered include: how to start a conversation with your child about online safety and understanding more about location services.

# Help from O2 Gurus

The O2 Gurus are trained to help you keep your child safe online by answering your technical questions. You do not need to be an O2 customer to access this support and can book an appointment in a local store of telephone the Advice Line. Some examples of information given include: setting up parental controls, privacy settings and live-streaming.

Additionally, the O2 Gurus are creating videos (found on the Net Aware website), which provide bite-size advice on a range of topics.
