

Literacy

This week, we have started our non-fiction unit based on 'The Street Beneath My Feet' by Charlotte Guillain. Throughout the unit, the children will practise applying a range of skills and combine this with their learning from our previous science unit (rocks and soils) to create an explanation text. Some of the skills they will be learning to use are: questions, exclamation sentences and synonyms.

Once we finished our science unit about 'Rocks and Soils', we worked in groups to give an oracy presentation based on Roger the Rock.










We focused on the physical characteristics of oracy: pace, tone, clarity, voice projection, gesture and posture, and facial expression and eye contact.

Maths

We are just finishing our chapter focused on the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. This involved the children looking at the times tables, exploring relationships between them and solving a range of problems (number and word) based on multiplication and division. This learning will continue to be reinforced during our daily fluency sessions.

Next week, we will begin to learn how to multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number.

Humanities

Our humanities unit for this half term focuses on Climate Zones. We have started to learn about the different climate zones found throughout the

world and how a place's location can affect its weather and climate.

Our learning

Literacy

Our learning this half-term continues to be around holiday brochures. We all want to go to Sicily for our holidays! Maths
