Our learning in Nursery

Topic

We continue our topic 'Exploring Our World', the children have loved exploring the jungle. We read the story 'Giraffe's Can't Dance', where we found out about all the different types of animal that live in a jungle. We then moved into a Jurassic World! The children have been learning very long names of dinosaurs and what it means to be extinct! We must take care of our world now as even animals now are at risk of extinction! In our final weeks of topic, we have a trip to the savannah to hear the story about the Lion and the Mouse, and how even the smallest of creatures can help those around them. In our final week, things will get chilly as we look at the contrast of an arctic adventure and all that will bring!

Maths

We have explored cardinal counting with our beaded snakes this week. The children used their number recognition skills to identify how many beads to place on the snakes and then counted out the correct number. Fine motor was involved in this activity as well!

This week we were looking at different ways to measure and fill space. We measured out the size of dinosaur foot and esitimated how many children's feet could fill it, we had 44 children's shoes and Mrs Tarling's big boots!

Expressive Arts and Design

Our artist this term is Henri Rousseau, we have been looking at some of his famous jungle and animal painitngs and recreating them with collage! The children have used lots of language around the topic and this has supported the skills to discuss pattern and shape as well as the

physical skills of cutting and sticking.

Our learning in Reception

Topic

We are continuing our topic 'Exploring the World'. We have continued to learn about our environments and the animals that live there. In forest school we have been learning how to peel carrots and be safe using new equipment. In Learning for life, we have been learning about healthy eating, keeping ourselves clean and learning how to rest our bodies when needed.

Maths

At the start of the term we spent time reminding ourselves of our number bond to 5 and chanting and singing numbers to 20.

The children have recently been learning what 5 needs to make 6,7, and 8. The children used the STEM sentence "5 and _ make _". Through the rest of the term we will move onto subitising larger numbers by 'finding the 5' and then onto looking at doubles within 10 before Easter.

Through our continuous provision, the children have constant access to maths learning to consolidate what we have done in class, and let them explore their own interests. Currently we are seeing how keen the children are to make their own number blocks!

Literacy


In literacy we have read the story 'Uno's Garden'. The children enjoyed learning about deforestation and protecting the animals who live there. We enjoyed learning the names of the animals in the story; including 'Mugglewumps' and 'Moopaloops'. We have also learnt about Antarctica and Penguins. We have written sentences about how it would feel to live in Antarctica. The children are very excited to learn about dinosaurs over the next couple of weeks. We will learn the names of dinosaurs, what happened to the dinosaurs and write about our favourite dinosaurs.
