Medication

A brief reminder that children should not bring in medication in their school bags and that non-prescribed medication cannot be issued at school. School Uniform

In preparation for September, as we know parents are already purchasing uniform, we wanted to clarify the uniform expectations for next year.

In Autumn and Spring Terms:

- Grey skirts / trousers or pinafore dress.
- White shirt / blouse / polo shirt
- V-neck 'Bierton' jumper or cardigan
- Bierton tie—clip on or elastic for Years 1-6 (There is no requirement for children in reception to wear a tie.)
- Black low heeled shoes

(Leggings, sportswear and trainers are not part of the school uniform. Jewellery is not permitted in school. Children may wear small stud earrings but these must be removed for PE. Children should only have plain head bands and hair fastenings. Large bows and fancy head bands are not permitted.)

PE Dress Code:

- Black shorts / Black Leggings / Plain Black Track Suit Trousers.
- Blue Bierton T-Shirt
- Navy 'Bierton' PE Hoodie
- Trainers or plimsolls
