Spirituality at Bierton



At Bierton, we dedicate time to exploring spirituality. This can be looking at the world through our curriculum, appreciating nature through our time outside or in the forest or through our collective worship. We use the Windows, Mirrors, Doors model for exploring these and call them our 'Pause and wonder (or PAWs) moments'. Children look out at the world, reflect on how it makes them feel and then consider what they might do as a result of this feeling.

Spirituality is not exclusively connected to religion. It allows children to take a moment to consider or appreciate something bigger than themselves and reflect on it. As a result of these moments, children may wish to find out more, raise awareness about an issue or pursue an interest in something.

Windows, Mirrors and Doors – Spirituality Questions

WINDOWS – Noticing

- What do you notice that makes you pause?
- What is beautiful, puzzling or surprising here?
- What feelings does this moment or image stir in you?
- What big questions does this open up?
- Where do you see hope, goodness or light in this situation?

MIRRORS – Reflecting

- What does this make you think about in your own life?
- How does this connect with your beliefs or values?
- What does this help you understand about yourself?
- What feelings are you aware of and why?
- What questions does this raise for you about God, life or others?



DOORS – Responding

- What could you do differently after thinking about this?
- How might this inspire you to act with kindness or courage?
- What step could you take to 'let your light shine' here?
- How might you express your response — words, art, prayer, action?
- What change could this lead you to make in our community?

Maths at Bierton

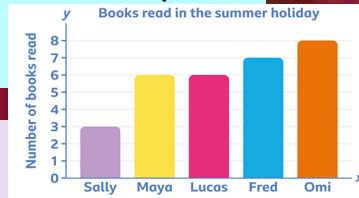
Representations: Bar Charts

A bar chart is a diagram that uses rows of horizontal or vertical bars to show information.

The title tells you what the bar chart is about.

The vertical and horizontal lines are called axes.

The horizontal line is called the x -axis. The vertical line is the y -axis. Both axes are always labelled, so you know what is being shown.



Helping your child at home: Cooking

Cooking offers fun ways to teach children maths while providing practical, hands-on learning experiences. Your child can learn about measurement, fractions, ratios, and more by incorporating maths skills into cooking activities.

These activities help children develop their maths skills and provide opportunities to practise the concepts they learn at school along with other key skills including critical thinking, problem-solving and decision-making, all while doing something fun and delicious.

Famous Mathematicians: Archimedes

Year: c. 287-212 BC



Archimedes was an ancient Greek mathematician, physicist, and engineer. He is known for his deep contributions to the understanding of the physical world and mathematical theorems.

Among his many contributions, the most famous is Archimedes' Principle, which explains the theory of buoyancy. He also made significant advances in geometry.

Fun Fact: Archimedes is said to have discovered his principle of buoyancy while taking a bath and ran through the streets naked, excitedly shouting, "Eureka!" (I have found it!).
